SAFETY IN THE WILDERNESS

It is important that travelers with Northern Alaska Tour Company understand that Alaska's Arctic is a truly remote wilderness region. Traveling through vast wilderness stretches requires adequate time and preparation. Weather or mechanical factors, albeit infrequent, can result in multi-hour delays. Medical facilities are limited. Limited communication and transportation infrastructure inherently cause evacuation for illness or other emergency situations to take, at the very best, several hours to conduct. For this reason, travelers to this region should be of reasonable health and physical condition.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

TOUR VEHICLES

Northern Alaska Tour Company strives to provide a personalized touring experience. Touring is done in small groups utilizing a 25-passenger tour coach. Occasionally, a 15-passenger van is used for smaller groups or special circumstances.

ACCOMMODATIONS

In the spirit of the remote wilderness, the overnight accommodations consist of very basic, clean rooms that are extremely rustic by urban standards. There are not private bathrooms in the rooms. There are private toilet and shower stalls in separate men's and women's facilities that are shared among guests. Pay telephones are available.

INCLUSIONS

The tour price includes a guided ground tour, Aurora watching at the Yukon River, and a room for one night at Yukon River Camp.

FOOD

Food is not included on this adventure.

The kitchen at the Yukon River Camp is only able to provide breakfast service on day 2. Until it fully reopens, we will make a QUICK stop at a grocery store on the way out of town. Once the Yukon River Camp kitchen re-opens we will no longer make the grocery store stop.

As always, guests may bring their own food—some hotels do sell sack lunches or other meals to go.

GUIDES

Northern Alaska Tour Company guides are highly-trained Alaskans who are able to share their unique understanding of Alaska with you based on their personal experiences. We are confident that you will find the level of service provided by your guide to be as high or higher than you have ever before experienced.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities Policy: As with other service industries, tips are not required but are used to reward guides for a job well done. Standard tip amounts range from \$15.00-\$25.00 per guest, per day for excellent service.

For this adventure you will have 3 guides. One for your guided ground tour to the Arctic Circle, one for your evening Aurora experience at the Yukon River, and one for your return trip to Fairbanks on day 2.

RESTROOMS

Outhouses are the norm for the Dalton Highway. Frequent rest stops are made along the tour route. The longest time period between stops is approximately 2 1/2 hours. Flush toilet facilities are available at Yukon River Camp.

SMOKING

The inside of all tour vehicles and rooming/dining facilities are maintained as smoke-free environments. There are opportunities to smoke outside the vehicle along the tour route.

WHAT TO WEAR / BRING

Layers are the key to comfort. While large parkas and snow suits aren't necessary, they do help. Whether or not you are lacking in heavy snow gear, layers can make winter comfortable. Start with a long/thermal underwear layer. On top of that you will want an assortment of undershirts, T-shirts, long sleeved shirts, sweaters, fleece vests and / or jackets, and a wind-proof shell. For the bottom-half try to have a long/thermal underwear layer, pants, and finish with wind-proof pants. Sock liners and wool or wool blend socks plus the warmest boots you can find will keep your toes warm. It is important to remember that the only wind proof layer you want is the outer one. Keep the inside layers breathable and shy away from cotton. Also try to use layers that go from snug to loose. To finish-off your winter wear bring a hat, scarf and mittens.

GUEST SAFETY

Guest safety is our foremost priority. Guides are licensed to operate commercial vehicles. Tour vehicles are CB radio and satellite phone equipped.

ALTERATION

PLEASE NOTE: Guest safety *always* takes precedence over convenience. On rare occasions, weather or other uncontrollable circumstances may require alteration/cancellation of a portion or all of the scheduled tour itinerary.

If the tour requires an additional overnight stay due to weather or uncontrollable circumstances the cost of accommodations and meals is the guest's responsibility.
