We highly recommend you do not plan activities that can't be cancelled on your first night back to Fairbanks.

SAFETY IN THE WILDERNESS

It is important that travelers with Northern Alaska Tour Company understand that Alaska's Arctic is a truly remote wilderness region. Traveling through vast wilderness stretches requires adequate time and preparation. Weather or mechanical factors, albeit infrequent, can result in multi-hour delays. Medical facilities are limited. Limited communication and transportation infrastructure inherently cause evacuation for illness or other emergency situations to take, at the very best, several hours to conduct. For this reason, travelers to this region should be of reasonable health and physical condition.

Yet it is the spirit of you the adventurer which is unquestionably the key to making the most of this travel experience. Travel in Alaska's Arctic is not for everyone. If you are young at heart, adventurous, have a desire to learn, to explore new territories, and to seek out new experiences, then the rustic aspects of traveling in Alaska's Arctic will be of little consequence to you. TOUR VEHICLES

Northern Alaska Tour Company strives to provide a personalized touring experience. Touring is done in small groups utilizing a 25-passenger tour coach. Occasionally, a 15-passenger van is used for smaller groups or special circumstances. The flight portion of the tour is conducted in 9-passenger aircraft: Piper Navajo Chieftains or Cessna Caravans.

FLIGHT WEIGHT / LUGGAGE

At the time of reservation, please provide the individual weight of each member of the tour party. The weight is required for proper balance of aircraft used for the flight portion of the tour.

WEIGHT LIMIT: Baggage is limited to 10-15 pounds per person. Luggage over 15 pounds is subject to be stored in Fairbanks.

FOOD

Food is not included on this adventure. Guests may bring their own snacks.

We do make a stop at Yukon River Camp where lunch can be purchased. Lunch is purchased prior to departure as part of the check-in process.

Once at Coldfoot Camp you can purchase all other meals or snacks at the Truckers Café.

ACCOMMODATIONS

In the spirit of the remote wilderness, the overnight accommodations consist of very basic, clean rooms that are extremely rustic by urban standards. The rooms are simple with 2 single beds and 3/4 bathroom. (shower no tub). Pay telephones are available.

RESTROOMS

Outhouses are the norm for the Dalton Highway. Frequent stops are made along the tour route. The longest time between stops is approximately 2 1/2 hours.

WHAT TO WEAR / BRING

Layers are the key to comfort. While large parkas and snow suits aren't necessary, they do help. Whether or not you are lacking in heavy snow gear, layers can make winter comfortable. Start with snug fitting long/ thermal underwear. On top of that you will want an assortment of undershirts, T-shirts, long sleeved shirts, sweaters, fleece vests and or jackets, and a wind-proof shell. For the bottom-half try to have snug fitting warm pants, sweat pants, and finish with wind-proof pants. Sock liners and wool or wool blend socks plus the warmest boots you can find will keep your toes warm. It is important to remember that the only wind proof layer you want is the outer one. Keep the inside layers breathable and shy away from cotton. Also try to use layers that go from snug to loose. To finish-off your winter wear, bring a hat(s), scarf and mittens.

GUIDES

Northern Alaska Tour Company guides are highlytrained Alaskans who are able to share their unique understanding of Alaska with you based on their personal experiences. We are confident that you will find the level of service provided by your guide to be as high or higher than you have ever before experienced.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities Policy: As with other service industries, tips are not required but are used to reward guides for a job well done. Standard tip amounts range from \$15.00-\$25.00 per guest, per day for excellent service.

You will have at least 3 guides for this Adventure: One for the guided ground tour Fairbanks to the Arctic Circle, one for the guided ground tour from the Arctic Circle to Coldfoot, and one for your Arctic Village Aurora tour out of Coldfoot. **OPTIONAL TOURS** - Available for purchase

ARCTIC SNOWSHOE OUTING:

Enjoy a guided outing on snowshoes on a trail near Clara Creek. The excursion lasts about 2 hours, with about 1 hour of snowshoeing.

DOG SLED ADVENTURE:

Enjoy time with real Alaskan sled dogs. Learn what it takes to have a dog team in Alaska. Enjoy a 1-1/2 hour experience. (Dec 15-Mar 31)

FAT TIRE BIKE ADVENTURE:

Explore the beautiful Coldfoot wilderness area on a fat tire bike. Bikes and helmets provided. 2 hours

GUEST SAFETY

Guest safety is our foremost priority. Guides are licensed to operate commercial vehicles. Tour vehicles are CB radio and satellite phone equipped. Weather conditions always dictate safe flight altitude. At times it is necessary to fly above cloud cover, thus reducing or even eliminating aerial visibility.

ALTERATION

PLEASE NOTE: Guest safety <u>always</u> takes precedence over convenience. On rare occasions, weather or other uncontrollable circumstances may require alteration/cancellation of a portion or all of the scheduled tour itinerary.

If the tour requires additional overnight stay due to weather or uncontrollable circumstances the cost of accommodations and meals is the guest's responsibility.

If the weather requires us to alter the return method of travel from air to ground it will be done as an equal exchange of travel.
